Precision Woodwork (Lake County)

If you ask Patrick Foss what motivated him to install new, environmentally-friendly equipment in his family-owned and operated custom woodworking shop in Mentor, he will tell you about his commitment to his community and his employees by providing a safe workplace and limiting emissions from his business.

His company, Precision Woodwork, was established in 1997 and specializes in cabinetry for residential, commercial and design-build projects.

Precision Woodwork used \$90,000 in financing from OAQDA through the Clean Air Resource Center (CARC) program to purchase and install a new custom made industrial paint booth for use in finishing cabinetry. The company also received a grant of \$5,450 for closing costs as well as an additional grant of \$27,000 to pay down the principal financed.
